


NEW HOPE PROJECT


FBHFH is also working to develop a 6.5-acre tract of land in North Richmond, with a generous land donation from the George Foundation. This new subdivision, "New Hope Lane," will provide 15 new homes for low income families in Fort Bend County and bring us one step closer to ending substandard and poverty housing in the community. The subdivision is in the final platting stages with the City of Richmond, and an HOA is being formed to manage the subdivision. FBHFH anticipates that homes will be ready for construction in the Fall of 2020, with 3-5 home builds planned per year. Since our inception in 1992, FBHFH has built 87 new homes and completed both critical and disaster repairs, requiring over **30,000** volunteer hours, approximately \$6 million in donations to fund these homes, and provided decent, affordable housing to over 500 persons.

2019 Total Volunteer Value: \$149,717

2019 Tithe: \$5,741 was used to build houses in the Country of Malawi in Africa

In 2019, FBHFH constructed 2 new homes in the North Richmond and Rosenberg area. FBHFH will complete 3 homes in 2020, through partnerships with Christ Church Sugar Land and Saint Lawrence Catholic Church.

FBHFH continues to provide the Critical and Disaster Home Repair Program, completing 116 homes since both programs began. In addition, FBHFH is working with elders on an Aging in Place Program, which effectively launched in the Summer of 2019.
